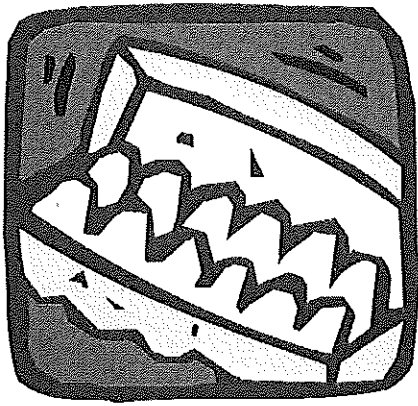

MULTIPLICATION LEARNING GAMES



Egg-Citing Multiplication

Write numbers in the bottom of egg cartons. Place two marbles in the egg carton. Close the lid, shake the carton, open the lid, and multiply the two numbers together.

Popcorn Multiples

The object of this strategy game is to think in multiples and be the player to place the last popcorn kernel into the cup. You'll need uncooked popcorn kernels and a small cup. To play, count out 24 kernels. Players take turns placing their choice of one, two, or three kernels into the cup. Continue until all the kernels are in the cup. The player who plays the last kernel wins the round. For more challenging play, use more kernels or allow players to choose one, two, three, or four at a time.



The Fact Family Buzz

Review a specific fact family with this challenging group game! The leader chooses a number between 2 and 9. The first player says 1; the next player says the 2, and so on. When a player reaches a multiple of the number chosen, the player says, "Buzz" instead of the number. If a player forgets to say buzz or says it at the wrong time, he or she is out. Continue until reaching the last multiple of the number times 9.

Multiplication Roll

Play this simple game during down time, waiting at a restaurant or a doctor's office! Players take turns rolling two dice, multiplying the two numbers, and scoring that number of points for the round. The winner is the player with the most points after five rounds.

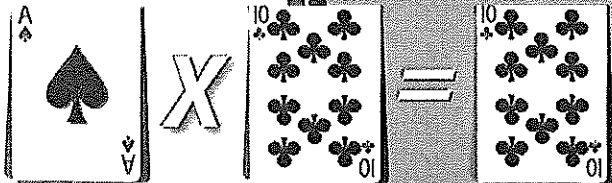


Multiplication

WAR!

This two-player game is played with a standard deck of playing cards. Remove the jokers and face cards OR explain the following point values: Ace = 1, Jack = 0,

Queen = 11, King = 12. Shuffle the deck and deal them all out face down. Each player flips over a card from his or her pile. The first player to multiply the two numbers and call out the correct product collects the two flipped over cards. If a player calls out the wrong answer the other player gets the cards. Players continue until all the cards have been flipped over. The winner is the player



Option: Remove the face cards from a standard deck of playing cards. Select one card and place it face up on the table. This is the base card throughout the game. Shuffle and deal the remaining cards to each player. Each player flips over a card from his or her pile and multiplies that card by the base card. The player with the higher product wins both cards. Players continue until all the cards have been flipped over. The winner is the player with the most cards at the end.
